In addition to feeding the children in the orphanage and providing them with clean, new mattresses, we have also built a large chicken coop to provide them with fresh eggs. We have committed to finishing four classrooms for the orphanage school so that the children will have safe classrooms that are conducive to learning instead of the tin huts they use now. Our vision, should funds allow, is to rent agricultural space so that the orphanage can provide fresh, wholesome food for the children year round. I am hoping to travel to Kenya early in the new year.



We are fully supporting, 50 children on a monthly basis from the Jewish community of Kechene, in Addis Ababa. This includes food, health care, and school requirements. We have also begun a women's empowerment program. After a recent health clinic, it was determined that several of the children were suffering from potentially life-threatening illnesses, such as type one diabetes. We are now supplying life-saving medication to several of these children.
